DAY 1

NICE - MONACO

Distance: 10 nm

Duration: 1 hour and 30 minutes

Temperature: 26°

Monaco is without doubt one of the French Riviera's most renowned destinations and one of the most glamorous in the world. The summer season sets off with the Formula 1 Grand Prix at the end of May where the country's pristine streets are transformed in to a racing circuit. This tiny Principality is home to all the designer brands at the new One Monte Carlo quarter, set right alongside the world famous Casino de Monte Carlo and Hotel de Paris. Here you'll also find a handful of Michelin Star restaurants, luxury hotels, casinos and sumptuous spas to enjoy a truly luxurious stop at the crown of the Riviera.

DAY 2

MONACO - ST. JEAN CAP FERRAT

Distance: 6 nm
Duration: 40 minutes
Temperature: 26°

The breathtaking peninsula of St. Jean-Cap-Ferrat is nestled between the renowned towns of Beaulieu-sur-Mer and Villefranche-sur-Mer. Well known for its luxury villas and hotels, it has been a favourite destination for Hollywood celebrities and the yachting elite for decades. All five beaches are public and offer amazing panoramic views. For some culture, don't miss the Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild, an Italian Renaissance palace on 10 hectares of landscaped gardens, which is now a museum and luxury event location open to visitors.

DAY 3

ST. JEAN CAP FERRAT - ANTIBES

Duration: I hour and 15 minutes

Temperature: 27°

Antibes is a lively resort town lying between Nice and Cannes, known for its roaring social scene and its l6th century walled old town which overlooks Port Vauban, with its mix of sailing and luxury yachts. A museum honouring one of the most popular concoctions in France – Absinthe – can be found here along with the more classic Picasso Museum, in the former Château Grimaldi. Here in Antibes you'll find long stretches of flat, white sandy beaches lapped by gentle turquoise waters. Baie des Milliardaires – with its rocky coastline, is the perfect spot to snorkel in the crystal clear waters.

DAY 4


ANTIBES - SAINT RAPHAEL

Distance: 25 nm

Duration: 2 hours and 40 minutes

Temperature: 30°

Just next to Frejus, at the foot of the Esterel Massif, lies the lovely resort town of Saint Raphael with its vibrant harbour, surrounded by beautiful beaches, and a lovely old town which is worth a stroll around, with its daily market, the 7th century Romanesque church and 13th century watch tower which offers splendid views.







DAY 5

SAINT RAPHAEL - SAINT TROPEZ

Distance: 11 nm

Duration: 1 hour and 15 minutes

Temperature: 30°

Saint Tropez is a small village with a big reputation. Made famous by Brigitte Bardot in the 1950's, this sleepy little town was transformed into a chic, hedonis celebrity spot each summer. It is still as chic as ever, a luxury location with extraordinary villas, boutique hotels, designer shops and luxury yachts lining the quaint old town. Not forgetting its beautiful beaches, such as Pampelonne, where you can experience the best clubs and restaurants all summer long.

DAY 6

SAINT TROPEZ - CANNES

Distance: 25 nm

Duration: 2 hours and 40 minutes

Cannes plays host to numerous festivals throughout the year, but is world famous for its film festival held in May, right before the Monaco Grand Prix. The palm lined Boulevard de la Croisette is home to plenty of designer boutiques, luxury hotels and spas. This glitz resort town also brags fabulous beaches, high-end restaurants and clubs making it a thriving summer charter destination not to be missed!

DAY 7

CANNES - LERINS ISLANDS

Distance: 3 nm

Duration: 20 minute

Temperature: 30°

Lying off the coast of Cannes is the small archipelego of the Lérins Islands, made up of the two larger islands of Ile Sainte-Marguerite and the Ile Saint-Honorat, and the two smaller, uninhabited islands of Ilot Saint-Ferreol and Ilot de la Tradelière. These unspoiled islands provide a wonderful escape from summer crowds on the Côte d'Azur coastline. Ile Sainte-Marguerite is famous for its Fort where the cell of the "Man with the Iron Mask" can be visited, along with numerous archeaological treasures. Ile Saint-Honorat is inhabited by Cistercian monks who have inhabited the island since around AD 410.

DAY 8

LERINS ISLANDS - ILE SAINTE-MARGUERITE - NICE

Distance: 25 nm

Duration: 2 hours and 40 minut
Temperature: 30°

One of the largest islands off the coast of glitzy
Cannes, Ile Sainte-Marguerite is all gorgeous pine
forests and charming coves – feeling a world away
from the exquisite boutiques and bars that make up
the French Riviera. Crystal clear waters, the fragrance
of eucalyptus, and ancient 17th-century forts that were
used as the setting for 'The Man in the Iron Mask' make
the Ile Sainte-Marguerite feel very special. History
lovers will also admire the old prison, hospital, and the
Royal Musee de la Mer with its shipwrecked artifacts.
Ile Sainte-Marguerite is every inch the beachy peachy
paradise you wished for, with rocky stretches and sugar
coves it is the perfect place to stretch out in the sun
in-between swims. While the island boasts a couple of
dining spots, picnics and pure exploration are the best
ways to spend your hours here.
